

# REFUEL STUDY: 1 PETER

## PECULIARITY 1 Peter 1:13-2:10

1. After the intro section (1 Peter 1:1-12), Peter quotes the Old Testament prophets at least once in every other section. As Christians, we are participants in the New Covenant. Why is it important for us to know anything about the Old Covenant?
2. V. 13 begins with the word “therefore”... what are some of the preceding truths we are reminded of by the word “therefore”?
3. In v. 14-15, we are told to no longer \_\_\_\_ to evil desires we once obeyed in \_\_\_\_, but to be \_\_\_\_\_. How does the Apostle Paul’s teaching in Romans 12:1-2 help us follow this word from the Apostle Peter?
4. In the next 5 verses, 1:17-22, Peter goes into detail about the preciousness of our salvation. What are some of the things he says that inspire you?
5. One of Peter’s themes in this book is that Christians are outsiders. We are pilgrims, aliens, strangers on earth. How is this theme reinforced in his description of Jesus in verse 4?

'But you are a chosen [generation], a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for His own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God’s people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.' 1 Peter 2:9-10 (ESV)
